In 1942, an elderly woman at the Presbyterian Church in Quitman asked her pastor after church one day whether there was a place for people like her so that they would not have to be a burden on their families and friends. That pastor, Rev, Frank McElroy Sr., knew that there should be such a place. On September 1, 1949, the Presbyterian Home opened in Quitman with three female residents.

For 75 years, Presbyterian Homes of Georgia has provided compassionate care for senior adults in an environment of Christian love. Across our communities, we serve residents of all religious affiliations and financial standing, and we offer a full range of residential options. There are six communities in the Presbyterian Homes family:
